Science: We spent the majority of our Science Classes doing progression tests this week, however, we did manage to save a little bit of time to finish up The Bee Movie from last week. Social Studies: Students went to Black Creek Pioneer Village to take part in a day of farming life. They enjoyed learning about the history of a farm, eating homemade bread and playing Pioneer games.
