#### **English**

The <u>Grade Six</u> class has enjoyed starting Julius Caesar in Book Club, eagerly volunteering to read the stage directions, and the character and narrator dialogue (speech). They proved to be "Punctuation Pros" by inserting commas in one passage and apostrophes of possession in another, as well as crossing out incorrect apostrophes in sentences. They have worked diligently on completing Stage 7 Practice Progression Tests, and their actual Progression Tests are scheduled for Friday June 8<sup>th</sup> and Monday June 11<sup>th</sup>.

The <u>Grade Seven</u> and the <u>Grade Eight</u> class were busy practicing for their *Romeo and Juliet* performance next week. The class also began an assignment where they will write a soliloquy for a character in the play.

#### **Social Studies**

The <u>Grade Six</u> students are finishing up their campaign videos for the Student Vote Assembly next Wednesday. They also wrote a quiz on the terms: Capitalism, Communism, Fascism and Anarchism.

The <u>Grade Seven and Eight</u> class started their presentations on the Political parties in the Ontario election. They will present these during the Student Vote Assembly next Wednesday. Next week the class will be learning about Communist China and the Korean War.

#### Math

In <u>Grade Six</u> Math, the students have finished ratios and proportions. They have started time. There will be a test next Monday.

This week the <u>Grade Seven</u> students did a hands-on activity to learn how circumference and diameter are linked. We worked on solving circumference and area of circles and students are busy preparing for the Chapter 18 Quiz which is on Tuesday.

In <u>Grade Eight</u> Math, the students have finished bearings and drawings. They have started on circles and then will be moving on to surface area and volume of 3D shapes. There will be a test next Tuesday.

## **Science**

In <u>Grade Six</u> Science, the students have been working on Micro-organisms and are watching them grow with their experiments. They have moved on to Eukaryotic cells and have been given an Organelle Assignment to earn more about them that will be due next Thursday.

In <u>Grade Seven</u> Science, the students have finished the digestive system. They have had a quiz on it and have moved on to the circulatory system. They also will be researching a digestive disorder due next Thursday.

In <u>Grade Eight</u> Science, the students have finished reproduction in flowers and will have a test on Monday. They will be moving on to adapting to a habitat.

#### **Health and Physical Education**

This week the students in Middle School started their Human Development and Sexual Health unit. This unit will continue next week.

#### **Grade Six**

The Human Development unit covers: development of self-concept, understanding of puberty changes, healthy relationships, decision making in relationships, stereotypes and assumptions, and some impacts and strategies for responding.

#### **Grade Seven**

The Human Development unit covers: Delaying sexual activity, sexually transmitted infections (STIs), and STI and pregnancy prevention. It will also cover sexual health and decision making and relationship changes at puberty.

#### **Grade Eight**

The Human Development unit covers: Decisions about sexual activity and supports, gender identity, sexual orientation, self-concept, decision making about contraception and relationships and intimacy.

#### Visual Art

<u>The Grade Six</u> students are learning about ancient Celtic gold jewelry design and are designing their own fibulas or pins featuring a Celtic stylized animal or mythological animal and Celtic knot work.
