Progression Tests are administered at the end of the school year in Maths and Science from Grade 3-8 and English from Grade 5-8. These tests are based on Cambridge learning outcomes that are specific to the child's current stage of learning. Teachers mark these tests and input the results into a report generator. These reports allow the teacher, the student, the parents, and the school administration team to see how the student did on each strand and sub-strand related to the subject. Teachers can use this report to help identify areas that may need improvement or areas that may need enrichment in the following school year. These tests also provide feedback on how the student is performing in comparison to other Cambridge schools internationally.
