History/Geography Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners learned all about Truth and Reconciliation in honour of National Truth and Reconciliation Day. 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Grade Four Weekly Update

Language Arts Mrs. Haddad	This week our fourth graders were hard at work distinguishing between the features of the first and third person. They used the speech bubbles in their books as a stimulus for discussion, and they were able to convey a story to each other from a different point -of-view. The Grade Fours used pronouns correctly and consistently. They were challenged to incorporate complex words to expand their vocabulary, and in so doing, learn how to express their thoughts more precisely. Great job everyone!
Math Ms. Sharma	The Grade Four Students loved to learn about Triangles and Symmetry. They learnt using different polygons and lines of symmetry by learning about different patterns. They learnt to draw lines of symmetry by learning about different shapes in a pattern.
Science Mrs. Haddad	The Grade Four Students observed different flowers in their habitat and used photographs to sort the flowers into groups according to how they were pollinated. Then they were given the opportunity to design and draw a flower that will attract insect pollinators. Learners were encouraged to explain their drawing to the class.
History/Geography Mrs. Haddad	This week, the fourth graders pulled out their maps to identify the lines drawn on them, pointing out the parallels, meridians, and hemispheres. The students took the time to locate where we are on Earth relative to the equator and the prime meridian. Students also learned how to use lines of latitude and longitude to write out the coordinates of any point on earth's surface. Way to work your way around a map everyone!
