<b>English</b> Ms. Carey	This week Grade Five and Six finalized their “Spooky stories” which they are so excited about reading out loud during our class on Halloween day. Students really displayed their creative side and displayed fantastic writing skills. Well done, Grade five and six.
<b>Math</b> Ms. Sharma	<p>This week Grade Five started working with Addition and subtraction (1). They enjoyed working on the word problems and even learnt about positive and negative integers. They started with Sequences and started exploring more about how to generate sequences. They’ll continue the work next week.</p>

They were introduced to a new concept of Motion.
