

Kindergarten Weekly Update

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Language Arts Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners learned the letters "C" and "K" and quickly realised that they both make the same sound! They also completed their first retelling activity using the story, "Room on the Broom." Finally they continued to practise their guided reading in small groups.
Math Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners were introduced to 6 new learning centres which focus on concepts we've been learning over the last few weeks. In their small learning groups, they were also introduced to even and odd numbers and practised sorting numbers into the two categories.
Science Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners wrapped up our Five Senses Unit with the movie, "Horton Hears a Who." They then began our Weather and Seasonal change unit by reading "What Will the Weather Be?" They have been working on a weather journal to track the weather and temperature.
History/Geography Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners learned about the United States of America. They were shown pictures of important landmarks, and got to make their own Statue of Liberty torches.
Visual Arts Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners completed a Halloween scene using oil pastels. They practised controlled drawing and colouring, and most importantly blending the colours to best understand how to use this material.

Students enjoyed a scavenger hunt looking for arrows to place on a number line, practised addition algorithms, and explored finding "addition pairs" to reach 100.
Students discussed the classification of animals and each animal types' characteristics with worksheets and a group activity.
Students began exploring the countries of Europe, their capitals, symbols, foods, and their landmarks, as well as reviewed facts of South America.

Grade Three Weekly Update

Language Arts Mrs. Haddad	This week the Grade Three revised simple sentences and practised using words with the /g/ and /j/ sound in their sentences. They recounted stories read dependently and independently, including fantasy. Learners were encouraged to determine the central message and explain how it is conveyed through key details in the text. Students then answered questions to evaluate their understanding of the text. Wonderful job everyone!
Math Ms. Sharma	This week students started learning about materials around us. They were very excited to learn about it by the activity of understanding about solids using ice popsicles, water-liquid, water vapour using a hot water cup- gas. They even pasted pictures about all the types of matter by segregating them into different forms. They will continue learning more about it.

Science Mrs. Haddad	For this week, the Grade Four students learned how flowering plants are adapted for seed dispersal and how seed dispersal is part of the flowering plan's cycle. They were able to complete a key to identify methods of seed dispersal. They made relevant observations and comparisons between the different seeds and enjoyed sorting them into groups according to the way they are dispersed.
History/Geography Mrs. Haddad	For this week, Grade Four students delved into the concept of time. Students identified the international date line, and the effects of crossing the date line from east to west or west to east. Students even had the chance to use time zones to calculate the time of day in different parts of the world. Great job, Grade Fours!
