

Kindergarten Weekly Update

Language Arts Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners learned the letters "B" and "L" and completed activities to practise their sounds and shapes. They also completed their second re-telling activity using the story, "The Little Old Lady Who Wasn't Afraid of Anything." In small groups they worked on decoding words with short "i" in the middle.
Math Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners continued to practise differentiating odd and even numbers and printing their numbers. The Yellow Math group was introduced to "Gus the Plus" and "Linus the Minus" and completed activities to add and subtract with 1 and 2. The Purple Math group is working on adding into their teen numbers.
Science Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners continued with their weather journals and discussed what they knew about the sun. They made a sun mosaic using torn paper to complement their learning.
History/Geography Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners reviewed their cardinal directions and learned about the American flag. They also added their first stamp to their passport!
Visual Arts Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners learned about mosaics. They were tasked with ripping yellow and orange paper to design a sun to complement their learning in science. They discussed how mosaics remind them of building a puzzle.

Language Arts Mrs. Haddad	The Grade Four students answered questions to gain an understanding of the text and identified key features. They then applied that knowledge to start writing their own twisted traditional tale in the past tense. The Grade Four students also had the chance to reflect on and identify their strengths as readers and areas for improvement. Great Job!
Math Ms. Sharma	This week grade 4 learnt about decimal addition and subtraction. Various examples were used to understand the concept and they did really great working individually over problems. They even learnt the concept of negative integers and they had a great time working with the negative numbers.
Science Mrs. Haddad	For this week, the students continued to find out what seed germination is and what conditions seeds need to germinate. The learners enjoyed the result of their science investigation experiment done on seeds. They soaked a bean seed in water overnight and they were encouraged to predict how the seed will change overnight and why. Learners observed the seed the next day and wrote down the changes that they saw. Students were successfully able to explain why changes happen. Keep it up!
History/Geography Mrs. Haddad	The Grade Four students demonstrated how a physical map can help them plan a route. They examined different trails and picked the best route to hike from Hidden Treasures Cavern to Camp Arrowhead. Students learned to appreciate the added safety value of referencing and carrying a physical map on a hike in the wilderness. Wonderful work everyone!
