

### Kindergarten Weekly Update

Language Arts Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners learned the letters "R" and "G," and completed activities to practise recognizing their sounds and shapes. In small groups, they worked on building CVC words using stamps, and understanding a short story. As a class, they completed their first prediction activity using the story, "The Good, the Bad and the Spooky."
<b>Math</b> Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners continued to practise addition and subtraction. Our Yellow Group was introduced to using manipulatives, and number lines to help them solve problems within 10, while our Purple Group was introduced to 2 digit by 2 digit addition without regrouping.
<b>Science</b> Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners learned about the rain and the wind. They were challenged to try and build a structure that could stand up against the wind, and were challenged to rethink their original plan if their structure was knocked over. Additionally, the class completed a water cycle activity to see what happens when rain clouds get too full of water.
History/Geography Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners travelled to Mexico and learned about traditional holidays such as "Dia De Los Muertos," foods, languages and the Mexican flag. They were also introduced to their first World Wonder, Chichen Itza, and were tasked to recreate it using Legos.
<b>Visual Arts</b> Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners continued to work on their sun mosaics from last week. They also had a great time completing different art stations on Halloween! Thank you to the parents who donated such fun activities!
<b>French</b> Mme Lechallier	This week the Kindergarteners practised to learn their winter showcase song "Petit flocon de neige." The students are still learning the vocabulary of the song "la neige, un flocon de neige, un coton, un sapin, un jardin, déguiser, un papillon, se cache."

### Grade One/Two Weekly Update

<b>Language Arts</b> Mr. Murray	Students continued working in the Cambridge Primary English textbooks, listened to the story James and the Giant Peach, continued reviewing the letter sounds and shapes, challenged with the spelling of important sight words, performed guided reading tasks in levelled readers, and began looking at nouns, verbs, and the use of commas.
<b>Math</b> Mr. Murray	Students continued to be challenged by subtraction with regrouping, and received extra individual help to work out calculation steps. Students were also challenged with different combination chains, in order to find sums with multiples of 2, 5, and 10.
<b>Science</b> Mr. Murray	Students looked at metamorphosis by exploring the life cycle of amphibians, and completed their unit test on Living Things.
<b>History/Geography</b> Mr. Murray	Students began exploring capitals, landmarks, symbols, and cuisine of different countries in Asia, including India, China, and Japan.
<b>Visual Arts</b> Mme Lechallier	The students are reaching the end of completing their project regarding Remembrance Day Posters and Art pieces to commemorate the event.
<b>French</b> Mme Lechallier	The week the students were introduced to their new poésie "Deux marrons" they learned the vocabulary of it , un marron "the fruit" pique, lisse, rond, hérisson.
