Language Arts Ms. Vela	This week the Kindergarteners were introduced to the letter Q. They learned that Q and U are the best of friends and they always stick together. In small groups they focussed on building CVC words with "e" in the middle, and in whole group lessons continued to practise rhyming words.

Grade One/Two Weekly Update

Language Arts Mr. Murray	Students listened to the story James and the Giant Peach, continued reviewing the letter sounds and shapes, challenged with the spelling of important sight words, performed guided reading tasks in levelled readers, looked at the use of commas in lists, and began looking at the rules of singular vs plural.
Math Mr. Murray	Students began identifying and constructing 3D shapes and their properties, including attempting to make cones, cylinders, and pyramids with play-dough.
Science Mr. Murray	Students explored chemical changes by observing the effects of mixing vinegar and baking soda. Moverover, students attempted to filter dirty water by creating their own filters with tissues, paper towels, and coffee filters, then discussed which worked best.
History/Geography Mr. Murray	Students began their unit on Ancient Civilizations by looking at The Sumerians. Students discussed the Geography, Culture, and Government of this Mesopotamian civilization.
Visual Arts Mme Lechallier	This week, the Grades One and Two are continuing working on their Chinese Art to create a Panda.
French Mme Lechallier	This week the Grade One and Two wrote a test on the syllable. Great work everyone! The students are finishing updating the last little details of their songs in order to be able to perform for you on the day of the Winter Showcase.

Language Arts Mrs. Haddad	The students revised topic sentences, subjects, predicates, nouns, verbs, and adjectives. They were able to split the runon sentences into two simple sentences and add either a subject or predicate to fragment statements to make complete sentences. Students also practised writing using simple sentences and adjectives. Great work!
Maths Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Three started learning about 2D shapes and they learnt about tessellation and were able to draw a tessellation of their own and they did a great job. They also started learning about symmetry and learnt the symmetry of different 2D shapes and even real objects to find out the line of symmetry of different shapes and had so much fun learning about it.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Three started learning about Volcanoes. They learnt how volcanoes erupt, and made a small volcano of their own using baking soda, vinegar and some food colour. They also learnt, using a world map, which parts of the world have volcanoes?. They had so much fun and were very excited to learn about Volcanoes.
History/Geography Ms. Carey	This week Grade Three discovered what life was really like for First Nations people when Europeans arrived in Canada. They learned why the Europeans first landed, the route they came and what they actually set out to explore before unexpectedly arriving in Canada. They really enjoyed learning so much about the First people of their land and what changed as a result of colonisation.

Students were encouraged to use the Geography Reader and their class notes to brainstorm ideas and construct a list of facts on which to base the structure of their writing. They were encouraged to use specialised vocabulary related to the topic. Get to work everyone!
Maths Ms. Sharma	This week Grade 4 started learning about Probability. They learnt about likelihood by comparing various real life examples. They even performed some experiments to see probability outcomes and then discussed their results.
Science Mrs. Haddad	This week learners investigated how to change the volume and pitch of sounds. They demonstrated on stringed instruments and wind instruments how to change the pitch of sound. They made predictions, saw if their predictions are correct, described a pattern in results, and made conclusions based on our scientific knowledge. They are working on presenting their results.
History/Geography Mrs. Haddad	This week the Grade Four explained how mountains act as barriers to human settlement and how people— driven by necessity and the entrepreneurial spirit — have found ways around these barriers. They confidently described the physical and social effects of living on mountains and communicated the results of their inquiry using appropriate and specific vocabulary related to the topic.
