

Kindergarten Weekly Update

Language Arts Ms. Petrie	In language arts this week, the Kindergarteners worked on our digraph blends 'll', 'ff', 'ss', and 'zz'. The students needed to sort images in correct columns that matched these sounds. The Kindergarteners also worked on their writing skills this week. They participated in a writers workshop while doing sticker stories. During centers, students worked on CVC words, digraph blends, and syllables. On Tuesday, new reading books were assigned to each student. To ensure further growth, please continue to read each night with your child!
Math Ms. Petrie	In math this week, the Kindergarteners continued working on their fraction skills. The students worked on showing halves, answering the question "what is half of", and sorting images that show half and do not show half. The kindergarteners participated in centers that reinforced their teen number understanding and subtraction skills.
Science Ms. Petrie	This week, the Kindergarteners finished their forces and motion unit. They worked with magnets this week, in a scavenger hunt activity. The students were given a list of objects that could be found in the classroom or hallway, and the Kindergarteners had to find and test if these objects were magnetic or non-magnetic.
History/Geography Ms. Petrie	The class began a new unit this week, which is all about Africa. The students learned about Egypt, including many of its famous landmarks. The Kindergarteners were very interested in learning about Ancient Egypt, specifically about mummification and pharaohs! The students made pharaoh crowns and an art activity about making pyramids!
Visual Arts Ms. Petrie	This week, the Kindergarteners began making their Valentine's Day crafts. Our class did some finger painting and created a beautiful multicolour heart tree. We also made some Valentine's Day cards for our loved ones, which focused on the Kindergartener's cutting, gluing and colouring skills.

French Mme Lechallier	This week, the Kindergarten Class is working on writing cards for Valentine's day to their Family. They continued on working with the vocabulary of the 'Ma Famille, ma maman, mon papa, ma soeur, on frere, le bebe, ma mami, mon papi. 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Grade Three Weekly Update

Language Arts Mrs. Haddad	In Grade Three English Class this week, our young scholars immersed themselves in the captivating world of the human body. With boundless curiosity, they continued their exploration through engaging reading materials, unraveling the wonders of anatomy and physiology. A highlight of the week was the integration of language skills, as students not only absorbed information but also practiced articulating their understanding by answering questions using complete sentences. Additionally, the week featured an insightful journey into the mechanics of grammar, with a focus on transforming both irregular and regular nouns into their plural forms. Through this comprehensive approach, our Grade Threes seamlessly combined scientific exploration with language mastery, fostering a holistic learning experience.
Maths Ms. Sharma	This week, the Grade Three Class started learning about comparing and rounding fractions. They worked on the concept by doing an activity on comparing fractions by colouring the different fractions and then worked on problems where they learnt to compare and order fractions.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week, the Grade Three Class continued learning about Energy. They learnt about the concept of energy transfer by performing activities where they beat a congo and learnt how movement energy changes to sound energy. They poured hot water from a beaker to a cup and observed how steam transfers to the surroundings. They learnt the concept of the cycle of energy transfer from water to its surroundings through this activity.
History/Geography Ms. Carey	This week, the Grade Three Class discovered more about life in Ancient Rome. They studied the people of Rome during this time; Patricians and Plebeians and completed a venn diagram to highlight the similarities and differences between both

	groups. They also drew their own interpretation of what these two groups of people looked like.
Visual Arts Mme Lechallier	This week, the Grade Three Class worked on a new project for Valentine's Day. The students worked with some clay to make a Valentine decoration to give to their parents.
French Mme Lechallier	This week, the students were introduced to a new poesie "Mardi gras" along with learning a new verb "Avoir" in present and future tense. The Grade Three work on to a new theme: Ma famille and les animaux." They also started to read little books and to write the words that they did not understand in the Dictionary section of their binders. Students are still in the process of learning their class songs "l'envie d'aimer, les Champs Elysées, attention mesdames et messieurs."
