

Kindergarten Weekly Update

Language Arts Ms. Petrie	This week in Kindergarten, we worked on the bossy e with i_e words. The students worked in small groups and whole group discussion to build upon their skills. The students participated in Wordly Wise, where they built upon their vocabulary and comprehension skills. The Kindergarteners worked on their writing skills in their monthly journals. The SK students have been encouraged to write independently, practicing sounding out words on their own. The JK students are encouraged to try and write independently, but support is provided when needed.
Math Ms. Petrie	In Math this week, the Kindergarteners continued to practice skip counting by 5s and 10s. The students engaged in worksheets, whole class practice, and centers. As an extension in small groups, some students have gone beyond and began skip counting by 2s.
Science Ms. Petrie	This week, our class continued working on sorting materials. Students engaged in discussion about providing examples of objects made of different materials. The class participated in sorting activities to show their knowledge.
History/Geography Ms. Petrie	This week, the Kindergarteners learned about the different animals that live in Australia. We looked at photos and videos showing the different species. We then painted our very own Koalas using a variety of materials from around the class!

Grade One/Two Weekly Update
