

Kindergarten Weekly Update

Language Arts Ms. Petrie	This week in language arts, our class reviewed reading and writing cvc words and words with digraphs. We continued practising working with the bossy e in the whole group and small group work. The Kindergarteners practised their rhyming by participating in a matching activity. New books were given out this week! Next week is the last week the Kindergarteners will be assigned reading books.
Math Ms. Petrie	This week, we prepared for our graphing project. The students worked in whole group examples where they helped make and label a graph. Students worked independently on worksheets to collect data, record their data in tally marks, graph their data, and answer questions about their findings.
Science Ms. Petrie	The Kindergarteners learned about the life cycle of a butterfly this week. We learned through informative videos, reading books, and singing songs. The students showed their learning through a butterfly craft where they needed to correctly label the four stages a butterfly goes through.
History/Geography Ms. Petrie	We only had one History class this week, and it was devoted to learning about the Tutelar Figures. We looked at photos, discussed our thoughts and opinions on the sculptures, and watched videos. The students were then encouraged to become creative and make their own sculptures out of clay.
Visual Arts Ms. Petrie	This week, the Kindergarteners learned about the famous artist Wassily Kandinsky. The Kindergarteners looked at a variety of artwork Kandinsky created, and we discussed different aspects of the art they noticed and liked. The class learned about what abstract art is, and tried to create their own. The students also made replicas of Kandinsky's Squares With Concrete Circles.
French Mme Lechallier	This week, the Kindergarten are continuing on working on their French project "Le Drapeau Français et l'emblème du Coq." Along

	with that, the students have been working on their class song and dance.
Health & Physical Education Mr. Makubuya	This week, our Kindergarten Class participated in a variety of different outdoor field games such as Endzone Escape, Sneak and React, and Jump the River!
Music Mr. Morales	The Kindergarten Class is focused on considering their role in music class next year. JK students moving up to SK will choose to do one more than the other in the choice between drumming and singing. SK students graduating to Grade One are selecting their orchestral instrument for the next school year among violin, viola, cello, string bass, and percussion. Students have started receiving focused instruction geared towards their instrument selection.

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Grade One/Two Weekly Update

Language Arts Mr. Murray	This week, the Grade Ones and Twos have been working on grammar exercises relating to synonyms and homophones, as well as making singular nouns plural. Students also continued learning the structure of letters and have been completing exercises from past Progression Test papers.	
Math Mr. Murray	The Grades Ones and Twos continued looking at fractions this week by adding and subtracting fractions with different denominators. Moreover, students were challenged outside by finding fractions of two-digit numbers using dandelions as manipulatives. Students learned that fractions are essentially multiplication and division problems.	
Science Mr. Murray	This week, the Grade Ones and Twos finished their unit on healthy living with an assessment. Moreover, students practised healthy habits by learning practical exercise techniques and designing healthy meals.	
History/Geography Mr. Murray	This week, the Grade One and Twos began looking at the Romans learning about the origin of Roma, and listening to the story of Romulus and Remus. Moreover, students looked at the geography of the Roman Empire, and discussed some English words that originated from Latin.	
Visual Arts Mme Lechallier	This week, the students are continuing on working on their French project on the "La Tour Eiffel" using water paint, clay, acrylic paint, pencil crayon.
