

Kindergarten Weekly Update

Language Arts Ms. Petrie	This week the Kindergarteners began reviewing what they learned this school year. The Kindergarteners practiced their beginning sounds with a sorting activity. The students enjoyed listening to many read alouds, especially the summer themed ones! The Kindergarteners engaged in writing activities. They started their June Journal and did some sticker stories, and we also did a "what are you doing this summer?" writing prompt. The students continue to practice their vocabulary and reading comprehension skills with their Wordly Wise activities.
Math Ms. Petrie	For math this week, we reviewed patterns. Students had to finish patterns, make their own patterns, and follow directions to create the correct pattern. Students made AB, ABB, ABC, and ABCD patterns. The class did a good job showing the knowledge they learned earlier in the year about patterns.
Science Ms. Petrie	Our class finished our Earth and Living Things unit this week. We looked at the life cycle of a frog. Students engaged in discussions, sorting activities, and making their own book about the frog's life cycle. The classes learned about the life cycle through interactive videos and books.
