## Grade Seven Weekly Update

### Friday, September 20, 2024

<b>English</b> Ms. Carey	This week, the Grade Seven class worked on language skills, as a class we explored auxiliary verbs. Students defined what an auxiliary verb was, identified them in a sentence and created their own sentence using them. Each student followed the basic clause pattern to create these sentences.
<b>Math</b> Ms. Sharma	This week, the Grade Seven class worked on the topic Indices. They learnt about indexes, how to use positive and negative indices, and the index laws of multiplication and division. They had a great class, understanding about the concept and participated actively in the discussion.
<b>Science</b> Ms. Sharma	This week, the Grade Seven class learnt about the structure, function and components of blood. They had a discussion about how blood transports oxygen and glucose for respiration. They were asked to make a mind map of the Respiration unit.
History/Geography Ms. Carey	This week, the Grade Seven class explored how landforms are created and how they change. Students focused on earth's moving plates (plate tectonics), students discovered that when these plates collide it creates mountains and sometimes earthquakes and when they pull apart volcanoes are formed. Students illustrated their knowledge of this by creating a diagram to show how these plates move and the results of such movements.
Global Perspectives Ms. Carey	This week, the Grade Seven class continued working on their topics; together they researched their chosen topic on a global scale and compared it to the issue on a local level. Students are really enjoying looking at the issues they have chosen and seeing how such issues are handled worldwide.

Students with previous experience were given new ways to challenge themselves with the simple exercises found at the beginning of the book. The class was also given an assignment where they will do research on blues music that is due next week.
