English Ms. Carey	This week, Grade Five has great fun playing a Shakespearean game of, 'Is it Shakespeare or is it Hip Hop?' Students worked together to unravel the mystery behind the quote and guess which quote belonged to Shakespeare and which belonged to Hip Hop. They were surprised in their discovery that Shakespeare is a lot more relevant than they realised.
Math Ms. Sharma	This week, Grade Five worked on rounding decimals. They learnt how to round decimals to the whole number and nearest tenths. They have been working with partners for some problems to review their understanding of the topic.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week, Grade Five learnt about the human respiratory system. They did a fun activity where they inflated a balloon and then deflated it to understand how air enters and leaves the human lungs while breathing.
