English Ms. Carey	This week Grade Five continued their journey of exploring Shakespeare through some of his famous Sonnets. Students wanted to put their muscle memory to the test as they identified the iambic pentameter in one of Shakespeare's most famous poems, Sonnet 18.

English Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Seven English class, students presented their creative writing piece that included vocabulary from their Wordly Wise lesson that have been completed thus far. Students displayed a variety of creative writing pieces, some students chose poems whilst others chose short stories. Some students decided to work in small groups and created mini chapters of a book. It was great to see the students use their creative side.
Math Ms. Sharma	This week, Grade Seven were introduced to the concept of Place value and rounding. They worked on the problems where they learned how to multiply and divide to 0.1 and 0.01. They even worked on problems where they learnt rounding decimal numbers.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week, Grade Seven were introduced to Force and how balanced and unbalanced forces work. They worked on an activity where they pushed and pulled an object and learnt about the force of a stationary object, and how force is still applied even if the object is steady.
History/Geography Ms. Carey	This week in History class, Grade Seven explored The First Nations territories before the Europeans came and claimed the land and resources of North America. Students were introduced to different tribes and identified how they worked alongside the land and gained from it. Students also learned about the fur trade and how it became such an important trade between the Europeans and The First Nations.
Global Perspectives Ms. Carey	This week in Global Perspectives, Grade Seven students incorporated their answers from the questions they asked at home, into their findings. This was to get some first hand information of how their topic/issue impacts people in their local area. The students really enjoyed this engaging activity as they got to hear the opinions of others on their research topic.
