English Ms. Carey	This week in English, Grade Five students discovered the difference between lambic Pentameter, Trochaic Inversion and Feminine endings. To put what they learned into practice, each student had to identify what variation of lambic Pentameter a Shakespearean quote belonged to.
Math Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five were introduced to counting and sequence. They learnt how to work on term to term rules and position to term rules. They even learnt about special numbers where they worked on square and cube numbers. They worked on various problems to understand the concept more.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five learnt about chemical changes. They learnt how reactions form products from reactants and cannot be reversed. They observed various activities where they saw chemical reactions taking place and learnt about rusting, and how iron can be preserved from getting rust.

English Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Six, students finalised their 'superhero vs villain' characters. Students identified the different characteristics that make a character a hero vs a villian.
