

Grade Five Weekly Update

Friday, October 11, 2024

English Ms. Carey	This week in English class, Grade Five learned about 'lambic Pentameter'. Students discovered that it is a rhythm containing five 'lambs'. We compared the rhythm to our heartbeat (de Dum), students identified lambic Pentameter in some quotes from Shakespeare plays. They had a lot of fun (and made a lot of noise) with this activity.
Math Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five learnt how to construct a circle using a compass. They learnt different parts of the circle and how to convert millimetres to centimetres and measure the diameter and radius of the circle.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five learnt about reversible changes. They were amazed to learn about it by doing some activities in the class, like melting ice and burning a match to see how reversible and irreversible changes differ from each other. They also learnt how we can make solid dissolve faster?. They like learning about these concepts as they can relate so much to what they see at home in the kitchen everyday.

English Ms. Carey	In English class this week, Grade Six were introduced to 'suspense writing'. Each student listened to the opening of a story that used this type of writing. Students then listed words that the writer used in order to create suspense. Afterwards, students created a plan to create their own introduction to a story using suspense writing, which they will begin writing in class next week.
Math Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Six learnt worked on the concept of collecting like terms and expanding brackets. They love working with algebra problems. They enjoy having discussions about constants and variables in algebra and how to solve for them.

English Ms. Carey	This week in English class, Grade Seven, students started putting their Wordly Wise words to the test. Students reviewed their words from lesson one to four. Choosing some vocab words in which they would use in their creative writing piece that is due for next Thursday. Each student chose their own creative piece in which they wanted to do. This is to show students the importance of creating a word bank that they can use to strengthen their vocabulary in their writing pieces.
Math Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven worked on constructing and solving equations and inequalities. They worked on various problems, and learnt the concept of open and closed circles and how intervals work.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week, Grade Seven learnt how to use paper chromatography to separate dissolved substances. They worked on interpreting chromatograms and using scientific terms accurately.
History/Geography Ms. Carey	This week, Grade Seven started their first chapter in History; the much anticipated wait to begin their history unit finally arrived! They kicked off this unit by creating their own heritage fair presentation. They identified the purpose, historical thinking required, research, whose perspectives they will include and what conclusion they think they will draw on. This is to introduce them into thinking like a historian when studying this unit.
Global Perspectives Ms. Carey	This week in Global perspectives, Grade Seven continued their extensive research on their chosen local and global issue. This week their aim was to finalise how such issues impact their local communities. They generated a list of questions that they were going to ask their families to find out how such impact them, then extend it to a wider community by carrying out a

	compare and contrast exercise with the rest of their class next week.
Visual Arts Mme. Lechallier	This week, the students are still continuing on working on two projects for the month of October: Halloween in 3d and Remembrance day Royal Canadian Legion contest.
French Mme. Lechallier	This week the students work in a group working on writing a halloween story that they will present in class by acting. The students continuing working on their conservation and their winter showcase song.
Health & Physical Education Mr. Makubuya	This week our Grade Seven class began their Fall fitness test! Completing part one this week before they attempt to beat their scores during their winter fitness test.
Wellbeing Ms. Carey	This week in Wellbeing Grade Seven students reflected upon ways they can demonstrate the traits of a friend. The purpose of this lesson was to focus on Interpersonal wellbeing: The extent to which learners feel connected to others, and that people care about them, treat them well and value them. Each student wrote out the word 'FRIEND' into their notepad and beside each letter placed a word to describe a friend using each letter of the word. Afterwards as a class, we brainstormed on the board the question 'What makes a good friend?'. Students really enjoyed this activity and it showed them what type of friends they like to be around and reflect on what type of friend they themselves are.
Music Mr. Morales	The Grade Sevens continued working through their Essential Elements textbooks, moving onto exercises ten to sixteen of the book where they are introduced to the first notes using the left hand. The class also began working on a new performance project, the song All Apologies by Nirvana which we hope to perform at the Winter Concert.
