<b>English</b> Ms. Carey	This week in English, Grade Seven read another poem by Chinese poet Tu Fu. They read the poem 'Visitors' and identified techniques in the poem. Students looked at the theme of nature and humans and the effects that humans have on nature. They discussed the viewpoint and what it said about the narrator and the purpose of the poem.
<b>Math</b> Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven finished working with construction where they learnt how to use a protractor and set squares to draw shapes using given measurements and angles. They were introduced to Sampling. They were explained about data and that it's divided into discrete, continuous and categorical using various examples. They conducted investigations and worked on various problems.
<b>Science</b> Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven learnt about pressure. They learnt how to calculate pressure using the formula and learnt how force and area are related to each other. The students had a great discussion where they gave various examples of the pushing effect of a force and worked on various problems to calculate pressure.
<b>History/Geography</b> Ms. Carey	This week in Geography class, Grade Seven started their unit on climate change. Students learnt about global warming and what are the contributing factors. They focused on an Avalanche in Switzerland, students compared the physical change that took place from 1948-2006. Students highlighted these differences and as a class discussed what they believed caused these changes.
