

Grade Five Weekly Update

Friday, February 21, 2025

English Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Five English, students went 'Back to the Future' as they began their next unit. Looking into the future, students read part 1 of 'The Green Book.' In groups they predicted what the future will look like, what will be invented and where in the universe we might go.
Math Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five worked on direct proportion. They learnt what "in proportion" means and learnt when one quantity increases the other decreases in the same ratio. They worked on various problems to understand the concept more. They challenged each other by giving problems to solve.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five started learning about mass and weight. They learnt the difference between mass and weight. They used examples to measure mass and weight using a force meter. They learnt how gravity affects weight and discussed how weight changes but mass does not.
History/Geography Ms. Carey	This week in History/Geography, Grade Five students focused on 'The Punic Wars'. They learned that the Punic Wars were a series of conflicts between Carthage and Rome. They summarised the events of each of the three Punic Wars and can now identify Hannibal and Scipio Africanus.
Global Perspectives Ms. Carey	This week in Global Perspectives, Grade Five students are working on improving their research skills. To do this, students looked at 'predictions'. Students decide whether a prediction is a correct result of carrying out an investigation.

English Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Seven English, students worked on comparing texts. They carried out many different activities in doing this. They compared and commented on texts with similar themes. Explored the conventions of Folk tales and made a reasoned choice about which stories they prefer to read.
Math Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven were introduced to sequences and functions. They were introduced to the topic by using various examples where they learnt how sequences and functions work. They learnt how to use a term-to-term rule to make a sequence of numbers. They worked on various problems to understand the concept.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven learnt about galaxies. They discovered that galaxies contain dust, gas, stars and other solar systems. They learnt about what galaxies are made up of and how many galaxies are there. They even learnt about shapes of galaxies and what is the distance of one galaxy from another.
History/Geography Ms. Carey	This week in History, Grade Seven students focused on 'History at work'. They discovered a lady named Kate Beaton, who is a historical cartoonist. They studied the skills she needed for this job, the types of cartoons that she creates and discussed what type of challenges that they believe historical cartoonists might face.
Global Perspectives Ms. Carey	This week in Global Perspectives, Grade Seven students focused on features of a good research question, how to write a good research question and how to write sub-questions to help

	answer research questions.
Visual Arts Mme. Lechallier	There are only a few students who are working on Mayan art by making masks and finishing painting. The rest of the class have been introduced to a new project to work on Black History, there are already some amazing pieces taking form.
French Mme. Lechallier	This week the students are continuing on answering sentences in writing by "qui, quand, ou, pourquoi". The sentences were introduced to their new poetry for March 3 on Mardi gras, the students are in pairs to create either the beginning or the end of this short poetry that they will have to perform in the front of the class by being creative and original.
Health & Physical Education Mr. Makubuya	This week our Grade Seven class learned about Fad Diets, what nutrition means to them for their overall health.
Wellbeing Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Seven Wellbeing, our students focused on two types of skills. Organisation and preparation. We spent some time reflecting on both sets of skills, identifying and understanding why these are important, how we can use them and ways we can ensure that we use them on a regular basis.
