Friday, February 28, 2025

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English Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Five English, students read a story about 'The green book'. Students explored ways we empathise with characters. They put themselves in their position and imagined how they would feel or what they would do in their situation.
Math Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five started learning about multiplication. They were tested on their previous knowledge of multiplication and they discussed the steps of how to multiply two digit numbers with two digit numbers. They then started working on problems related to the topic to enhance their learning.

Grade Six Weekly Update

English Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Six English students explored how events in a story are sequenced and linked by time. They highlighted time connectives in a story they read and gave some examples of their own time connectives that they would use quite often when they are writing their own stories.
Math Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Six started learning about the concept of sequences and functions. They were introduced to the concept of generating sequences. They learnt about the term to term rule and how to write a sequence using the rule and find the next terms in the sequence.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Six explored acids, bases and indicators. They learnt by observing different day to day use objects like - citrus fruits, coffee, milk, water, detergent, toothpaste to learn about the acid and base level. They will be performing an activity to observe the pH level of different liquids and use of different indicators.

Math Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven learnt how to calculate the nth term of a sequence. They learnt how to find different terms of a sequence by using different rules of sequences. They worked on various problems to understand the concept.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven learnt about galaxies and rocks in space. They learnt about the shape of different galaxies and learnt how a galaxy is coming close to our milky way. They also learnt about asteroids and learnt about the largest and smallest asteroid known.
History/Geography Ms. Carey	This week in History, Grade Seven explored the cause and consequences of The Battle of the Plains of Abraham in 1759. They focused on the intended and unintended consequences of the conquest. They also stated what the short and long term consequences were.
Global Perspectives Ms. Carey	This week in Global Perspectives, Grade seven students further developed their researching skills. They explored the features of a good research question, how to write a good research question and how to write sub-questions to help answer research questions.
Visual Arts Mme. Lechallier	There are only a few students who are working on Mayan art by making masks and finishing painting. The rest of the class have been introduced to a new project to work on Black History, there are already some amazing pieces taking form.
