### Friday, March 28, 2025

English Ms. Carey	This week was a very exciting week in Grade Five English, students participated in our Spelling Bee. We started with an in class Spelling Bee, in which students had the opportunity to compete for a place in the whole school competition. Three students made it through to the next round. It generated a lot of fun and friendly competition in the classroom.
<b>Math</b> Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five reviewed multiplication and started with division. They worked on various questions of division where they divided the whole number up to 1000 by 1,2 - digit whole numbers. They learnt rules of testing divisibility of how they can easily test by using numbers without doing long divisions and work on various problems to understand the concept more.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five learnt about Buoyancy discovered by Archimedes and learnt how it explains how objects can float and sink. They performed an activity to understand the concept where they used different objects to understand how mass affects floating and sinking. They were then introduced to circuits and circuit diagrams. They learnt how to draw conventional symbols of a circuit.

# **Grade Seven Weekly Update**

English Ms. Carey	This week was a very exciting week in Grade Seven English, students participated in our Spelling Bee. We started with an in class Spelling Bee, in which students had the opportunity to compete for a place in the whole school competition. Three students made it through to the next round. It generated a lot of fun and friendly competition in the classroom.
Math Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven started working on Graphs and functions. They learnt how to represent situations in words and using functions. They learnt how to write a function for word problems. They learnt to construct a table of values for a function and use the table to plot a graph. They worked on various problems and using a table they calculated coordinates and plotted them on a graph.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven started learning about Nutrients. They were introduced to all the six components and how these nutrients play a vital role in the growth of the human body. They learnt about macronutrients. They did a test for starch using iodine solution in the laboratory using apples, bread and sugar.
History/Geography Ms. Carey	This week in History and Geography, Grade Seven students focused on patterns of rivers and oceans. They studied the water system and described its function, they illustrated and labelled the characteristics of rivers and oceans and discussed how rivers affect the land.
Global Perspectives Ms. Carey	This week in Global Perspective, Grade Seven students began thinking about analysis. They worked together in small groups to take on the challenge of global brands and globalisation. Students worked together to think about problems with global brands, what some consequences are of big brands being everywhere and why certain big brands are so well known.
