



# Grade Five Weekly Update

**Friday, April 25, 2025**

<b>English</b> Ms. Carey	This week Grade Five students focused on spelling, grammar and punctuation in a bit more detail this week. Students created a list of common suffixes that they know and discussed spelling rules around them.
<b>Math</b> Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five were introduced to Multiplication and division of decimals. They learnt how to multiply and divide a proper fraction by a whole number. They worked on various problems to understand how to estimate then multiply numbers with up to 2 decimal places by a 1- digit whole number.
<b>Science</b> Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five learnt how light travels when it reflects. They learnt how to draw diagrams to show how light reflects from a plane mirror. They observed by doing activity of how we can see objects using a mirror. They also learnt how light travels in a straight line.

# Grade Seven Weekly Update

**Friday, April 25, 2025**

<b>English</b> Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Seven English, students were introduced to different strategies that they could use to spell unfamiliar words, considered how adverbs can add detail and meaning to sentences and how writers present and develop characters in a story.
<b>Math</b> Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven focused on calculating the volume of triangular prisms and calculating the surface area of triangular prisms and pyramids. They worked on problems to understand the concept further and challenged their partners by giving them questions to calculate the volume and surface area of prisms and pyramids.
<b>Science</b> Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven were introduced to Chemical reactions and elements in the periodic table. The students were given the list of first twenty elements and then discussed the name and atomic numbers. They learnt how chemical reactions give out energy by observing a few reactions.
<b>History/Geography</b> Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Seven History, students continued exploring Loyalists in British North America during the period of 1775-1800. They examined the various causes of the loyalist migration and the various groups that made up the Loyalist and examined their experiences as immigrants.
<b>Global Perspectives</b> Ms. Carey	This week in Global Perspectives, Grade Seven revisited the handout from last week. Students divided themselves into pairs and focused closely on one picture from that handout. Each student wrote a commentary for their chosen picture. As a class, we discussed all five pictures and each student listened to the commentaries being read and recorded the information.
