

# **Grade Five Weekly Update**

## Friday, May 2, 2025

<b>English</b> Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Five English, students discussed and compared two places using facts, opinions and connectives. Students worked in small groups and discussed questions such as; do you live in a hot or cold place? Which do you prefer?. They also explained in their own words the difference between a fact and an opinion.
<b>Math</b> Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five worked on multiplication and division of decimals. They learnt how to estimate and then multiply and divide a number with 1 or 2 decimal places by a 1 or 2 digit whole number. They worked on various problems to understand the concept.
<b>Science</b> Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five were introduced to the concept of Refraction. They learnt how a ray of light changes direction when it travels through different mediums. They did an activity where they demonstrated how light travels when it refracts using a glass of water and a pencil.

<b>English</b> Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Seven English, students continued exploring the theme of friendship, loyalty and social class inequalities as they journeyed through their novel 'The Outsiders'. Students each created a chart in which they gave an example of each of the themes, and how they impacted on the story.
<b>Math</b> Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven worked on interpreting and drawing frequency diagrams. They worked on the problems to draw and interpret frequency diagrams for distance and continuous data. They learnt how to draw and interpret time series graphs, stem-and-leaf diagrams and worked on various problems.
<b>Science</b> Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven learnt about exothermic and endothermic reactions and how to distinguish between the two. They observed and performed various chemical reactions in the lab to observe the difference between the two reactions.
