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# **Grade Seven Weekly Update**

### Friday, May 16, 2025

English Ms. Carey	This week in English class, Grade Seven explored the features of the dystopian fiction genre. They expressed personal responses to some texts and considered how context can inform the writing and reading of a story.
<b>Math</b> Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven were introduced to position and transformation. They learnt to use bearings as a measure of direction. They worked out the coordinates of the midpoint of a line segment by working on various questions. They worked on translating shapes on a coordinate grid using vectors.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Seven learnt about reactions of metals with acids and how they form salts. They worked on worksheets to understand how endo and exothermic reactions work. They were introduced to the topic magnetism and will continue to learn about it.
History/Geography Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Seven Geography, students worked together and created a slideshow profiling a national park of their choosing. They included the location, a brief history, the reasons it's protected and the benefits of protecting it.
Global Perspectives Ms. Carey	This week in Grade seven Global Perspectives, students focused on what the term 'evaluation' means. Identifying the difference between evaluation and analysis and how we can recognise something that might be 'fake news'.
