

Grade Five Weekly Update

Friday, May 30, 2025

English Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Five English we focused on poetry at play. The students explored poetic licence, what interesting language and format is used to create a string poem and the difference between a cinquain poem and a Limerick. They identified the different features of the poems and then created their own one.
Math Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five learnt how to rotate shapes around a centre(vertex) point and reflect shapes using a mirror. They worked on various problems to understand the concept more. They even drew an image on their own and drew a reflected shape using a diagonal line.
Science Ms. Sharma	This week Grade Five learnt how much time does each planet in the solar system take to complete one rotation and revolution around the Sun based on Earth days and years. The students even learnt about Galileo and how he invented the telescope and discovered craters on the moon, sunspots on the Sun and phases of the planet Venus.

Grade Six Weekly Update

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English Ms. Carey	This week in Grade Six English, students focused on how language is used to persuade the reader. They identified key words and phrases used as persuasive techniques and demonstrated that they can use persuasive language in their own writing.
