

### Kindergarten Weekly Update

Language Arts Ms. Petrie	In Language Arts this week, the Kindergarteners learned the digraph blends ER, OR, and AR. The students practiced brainstorming words with these sounds, and completing writing worksheets to show their knowledge. The students completed their Wordly Wise workbooks this week! The Kindergarteners have created a strong foundation of reading comprehension and vocabulary skills, which will prepare themselves for Grade One. The students ended the week by writing Father's Day cards.
<b>Math</b> Ms. Petrie	This week in Math, the Kindergarteners continued to learn about bar graphs and pictographs. They interpreted data from graphs to answer corresponding questions. They also gathered data, graphed it, showed data in tally marks, and then answered questions. The students finished their statistics unit. Next week, they will focus on reviewing concepts taught throughout the year!
<b>Science</b> Ms. Petrie	In Science this week, the Kindergarteners continued learning about materials. They practiced identifying materials, as well as identifying materials that are recyclable. The students also became familiar with changing materials, and terminology such as compress, stretch, twist, and bend. To end the week, the Kindergarteners brought in their recyclable materials, and were encouraged to create a toy with the materials. They loved this hands-on experience!
History/Geography Ms. Petrie	In History, the students completed their Antarctica unit. The students became familiar with the animal species that live in Antarctica, and complete activities to show their learning. They wrote a fact sheet about Emperor Penguins, completed a worksheet where they had to sort animals that live in Antarctica and ones that do not, and also complete matching worksheets that had the students label

	the animals to their names.
<b>Visual Arts</b> Mme. Lechallier	This week the kindergarten worked on creating a flower pot with the flower, the students will be using paint for this project.
<b>French</b> Mme Lechallier	This week the students are having some fun games in French " simon a dit touche la tete" un , 2 , 3 soleil.

## Grade One Weekly Update

Language Arts Ms. Petrie	In Language Arts this week, the Grade Ones presented their rhyming word lists to the class. They all did a wonderful job presenting their rhyming words. The students reviewed word endings that have been taught throughout the year (i.e., -ful, -ly, -y, -ed, -ing), and completed activities in their Cambridge Workbooks to show their knowledge. The students also practiced their reading comprehension skills. They read multiple passages and answered questions about what they had read.
<b>Math</b> Ms. Petrie	In Math this week, the Grade Ones learned about Capacity. The students became familiar with litres and millilitres, and answered questions in their workbook to practice their skills. Later in the week, the Grade Ones were introduced to patterns and probability. They completed work in their workbooks to practice these skills that were taught.
<b>Science</b> Ms. Tohill	This week in Science, Grade 1 students explored the solar system and the phases of the moon. They learned fun facts about each planet and discussed their unique features. Students used their creativity to design their own imaginary planets, deciding on details like colour, moons, weather, and who might live there. To finish the week, they began a hands-on craft to learn about the phases of the moon, building their understanding of how the moon changes shape in the night sky. It was an exciting and imaginative week of space discovery!
<b>History/Geography</b> Ms. Tohill	This week in History and Geography, Grade 1 and 2 students focused on key moments from religious history. The class read <i>Chapter 3: The Flight from Egypt</i> , discussing the story and completing a related activity page. To end the week, students read <i>Chapter 4: The History of Christianity</i> and reflected on what they learned by completing a prayer-themed worksheet.

<b>Global Perspectives</b> Ms. Tohill	During Monday's lesson, they completed a worksheet where they drew their family or special people in their lives and wrote about the important lessons they've learned from them. This activity encouraged reflection on values like kindness, responsibility, and love. Students who finished early enjoyed working on a family-themed wordsearch and crossword puzzle. Grade 2 students used this time to complete their Language Arts progression test.
